RADIO, AUDIO & MUSIC

• Ground Zero Radio | gzradio.org

 Ground Zero Radio is a youth-led web radio platform to connect the community through activism, sports, culture, music, and the arts, supported by The Vera Project. GZR is a careerlearning program for youth to learn skills and connect with professionals. You may apply for one or multiple departments. No experience necessary.

• Jack Straw Productions | jackstraw.org

- Jack Straw offers all-ages audio workshops on topics like podcasting, field recording, audio mixing, and microphones at their University District studios. Classes generally range in cost from \$50-\$100.
