NARRATIVE

On 7/25/20 I was working uniformed mountain bike patrol as 2k97. I was assigned to the king90 bike squad and we were assigned as crowd management for protests. Today, was an extremely violent protest where there were large scale fires being started, rocks being thrown, bottles thrown, large explosives causing significant injury to police, and large scale property damage. It was announced over radio that this was a riot and that there were multiple dispersal orders given.

At around 1741hrs I observed a group of people throwing large rocks at officers. I observed one of them strike A/Sgt. Eastman. In front of the group was a female wearing a white helmet. That female was later identified as A/Six, Samantha. Six was standing with her back to officers and acting as a "shield" or blocker to the suspects throwing the rocks. As our police line was approaching, we gave many commands to leave the area and told them they would be subject to arrest if they did not leave. Six was not leaving the area and was slowly walking and stopping trying to stop our police line from moving forward. I pushed Six forward and told her she needed to leave the area. I specifically pointed at and touched Six's back to make it clear I was addressing her, and told her if she did not leave, she would be arrested. Six refused to start leaving. Six was holding onto the group in front of her and they were holding onto her. This was a clear team tactic on their part to try and disrupt our police line and lawful orders to disperse. Six was physically using her body to stop our police movement. I went to pull Six through the police line and place her into custody. Six was resisting my attempts but I was able to get her onto the ground so I could place her into custody. While I was attempting to place her into custody, Boyd, Damien was trying to pull me off Six and tackled Ofc. Hay.

After I placed Six into custody, she was extremely uncooperative and was screaming and yelling. We were taking rocks and other objects at the corner of the intersection, Harvard AV/E Olive ST. For our safety and the arrested suspects safety we needed to move them West on E Olive ST, away from the hostile crowd. I asked Six to stand and attempted to help lift her up, Six just went limp and stayed dead weight. Due to the hostile crowd and extreme danger of being his with large rocks, myself and A/Sgt. Eastman, carried Six down the block on E Olive ST.

Once we were in a safer location Six started to not respond and closed her eyes. Six then appeared to have a seizure. SFD was called and responded to the location. SFD checked Six's vitals and cleared her for transport to West Precinct. Six was transported to West Precinct. At the West Precinct, Six again was screaming and claiming she had a seizure, SFD responded a second time and cleared Six. Six was then transported and booked into KCJ for SMC 10.24.080 Obstruction.

Sgt. Bair #6110 screened the arrest in person at the scene.
